CLARIFICATIONS TO THE MOOT PROBLEM

December 1, 2014

The following clarifications are provided in response to the questions for clarification submitted to the IP Moot Committee:

1. The Supreme Moot Court for Intellectual Property Appeals is the final court of appeals. A decision of the Supreme Moot Court for Intellectual Property Appeals is not appealable to the Supreme Court of Canada.
2. The marks Just Roo It and Just Moo It are used only with the design elements described in the Problem, if any. With respect to the t-shirts displayed on Janet's Summertime Yogurt stand, the words "Just Moo It" and design elements are featured with equal prominence.
3. Kangaroo sells shoes and apparel suitable for use in sports, although many of their products, including the Just Roo It t-shirts, are worn casually by consumers.
4. The surname "Dough" in the Problem is pronounced "Doe".
